FINANCE: TREASURER'S NOTE

SPRING: DON'T TAKE IT FOR GRANTED

For 5 continuous years, the township remains in good financial health. Over the last 5 years, we have seen our credit rating from Standard & Poors increase twice and our financial audits from our independent Auditors state that the township's fiscal management practices are very good. These key compliments are always positive information should the township need a loan for an unforeseen circumstance.

Good financials don't always translate into grant awards, however. Although most grants, either from the County or State, require "matching funds" which are generally 50% of the cost of the project (we have reserves and funds earmarked for capital improvements) projects for the less financially healthy projects that are "voter-friendly" are sometimes more popular recipients of grant awards. Our township's applications for a generator to create a Red Cross Emergency Shelter or for parks equipment did not fare well, for example. However, we do get awarded grants throughout the year, because of the hard work of the township staff and supervisors and support by our Congressional, State, and County Representative and Senator.

We are thrilled to report that we received a sizeable grant to extend our sewer line further into our Commercial District! (See more below in the sewer section)

We have also received a grant from St. Luke's University Health Network for our Community Gardens Park. (more on page 8) We thank our reps for their support.

Alas, the arrival of Spring also signals the arrival of your local tax bill (Summer heralds in your school tax bill). We are often asked what your local (county, municipal, and library) taxes provide. Your local tax bill came with an insert explaining your municipal taxes: you do get a lot for your local taxes. Middle Smithfield Township is among the few that maintain over 74 miles of roads, offer 5 parks, and provides numerous community services. The township also supports our emergency services providers (fire and ambulance) and many organizations that provide needed services to our community, such as the 2017 Person of the Year organizations, Bushkill Outreach, Operation Chillout and Mady's Kitchen..

We were pleased to report that we ended 2016 in a positive position as our conservative budget estimates proved to be in-line with income and expenses for the year. And our positive outlook for 2017 expects this year to be just as good financially, which supports our plan to make some major improvements to our township this year.

SPRING INTO ACTION: CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

As you know, the Middle Smithfield Township Municipal Sewer System is an aging system, and a plan was created to ensure that service is not interrupted to our nearly 2,000 customers, and to keep the system in good working order. The biggest news for our improvement plan? The Middle Smithfield Township application for the Frutchey Road Sewer Line Project was approved for an LSA (Local Share Account) Monroe County Grant at the March 29, 2017 CFA (Commonwealth Financing Authority) Board meeting in the amount of \$200,000. This grant will enable the township to extend the sewer line laterally into the commercial district.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR 2017

- Rehabilitation of Pump Station #1: This project involves providing and installing all equipment, materials and labor to replace the existing 150,000 gallon Steel Equalization Tank/Pumping Station at the Fernwood Wastewater Treatment Plant. Bids were opened for this project on March 23, 2017.
- Steel Bridge Pump Station in Winona Lakes: plans have been approved, and work will begin in April
- Upgrades to Pump Stations:
 - Bids are tentatively scheduled to be opened on May 11.
 - Pump Station 3 – McCole and Route 209
 - Pump Station 4 – Maple Lane
 - Pump Station 5 – Rte 209 & Municipal Dr
 - Pump Station 8 – Lake of the Pines Pump Station

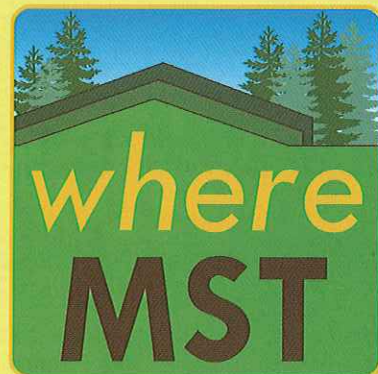

Only leaves will be picked up – no sticks, limbs, stumps, grass clippings or any other yard waste. Leaves must be placed at the road edge and must not be in bags.

The schedule is subject to change without notice depending on weather, volume of leaves of other emergency that might arise. Under township ordinance, open burning of leaves is prohibited.

If you do not live on a Township Road your leaves will not be collected. However, you are welcome to drop off leaves and brush at your HOA's central drop-off or the Oak Grove Multi-Municipal Compost Facility located at 3305 Oak Grove Road, East Stroudsburg, PA 18302. The hours of operation are Monday through Saturday, 7am-2pm. Closed on holidays.

SPRING IS HERE! TIME FOR FREE MULCH/COMPOST/WOOD CHIPS

The Oak Grove facility is a regular provider of mulch and compost to the MST Community Gardens Park on Coolbaugh Road. Your garden can benefit too! Self-serve products and materials offered at the facility are free mulch and compost (pending availability), and you must load the materials yourself. If loading assistance is needed an appointment must be made in advance and the fee is \$10 for each 3 yards.

The Oak Grove Multi-Municipal Compost Processing program is jointly operated and available to residents of Middle Smithfield, Smithfield and Lehman Townships. The facility is centrally located on Oak Grove Drive in Middle Smithfield Township and is open **Monday – Saturday, 7am – 2 pm (Closed Holidays)**

Acceptable materials include leaves, shrubs (no roots) and shrubbery, tree trimmings, and branches cut into 3 -4 foot lengths and no larger than 12 inches in diameter

TOWNSHIP SPRING CLEANUP (AKA "DUMPSTER DAY") AND FREECYCLE

- Middle Smithfield Township's annual Spring Clean Up is Friday & Saturday, May 5th & 6th from 7am-4pm
- FREECYCLE: Residents can drop off gently used items knowing they won't go to a landfill. Instead, they will go to a neighbor or charitable organization that will put them to good use.
- Free paper shredding is Friday, May 6th from 9:00AM – 3:00PM; locked bins will also be on the premiss for drop off on Friday & Saturday.

Residents must bring proof of residency such as tax bill, rent receipt, driver license, etc., in order to participate. This clean up is an extremely "user friendly" program. We urge all residents to take advantage of this opportunity. Especially since Bushkill Outreach will NOT have their Memorial Day yard sale this year.

Each year, we are thrilled that so many residents take the time and pride in their properties to clean up, and dispose of refuse properly (instead of in the woods or on our roads), and then go the extra mile to see what they can donate to Freecycle for their neighbors.

SPRING CLEANING: VOLUNTEERS NEEDED TO HELP CLEAN TOWNSHIP ROADS

On Saturday April 29, please join Township Supervisors, Parks & Recreation, Litter & Beautification, Adopt a Road, and the Public Works Department to help clean up our Township's Roads.

"Middle Smithfield Township is a beautiful community within the Pocono Mountains. When our residents and business owners join the township in cleaning up 1,000 feet of street at a time, miles of beautification can be accomplished in just a short time," said Michael J. Dwyer, Township Supervisor.

How this works: Volunteers will meet at the Township building at 8am the morning of April 29 for supplies, be split into groups, and depart to various locations throughout the Township to beautify Middle Smithfield. The Township volunteers will focus on our "Main Street" Route 209 and other roads throughout the Township. Middle Smithfield Township will provide reflective vests, road crew signs, and other supplies as needed. Breakfast is available at sign in and each volunteer will be provided with a snack from Sunoco Mini Mart to take as they clean. Volunteers to the Spring 1000 Feet of Street also receive a Free Pass to the fall Township Cleanup and Freecycle as a thank you.

COOLBAUGH ROAD SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

Now that winter is over, we are focusing on road improvements. While a number of roads will be repaired and or paved, a major safety improvement project is about to begin.

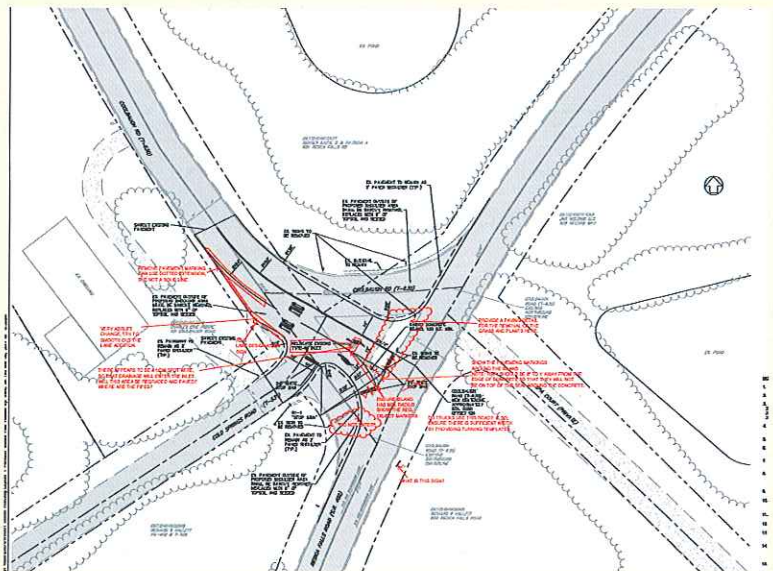
Major changes are going to be done at the intersection of Coolbaugh Road and route 402 (Resica Falls Road.) As you can see from the plan (inset), the major sweeping right turn onto Coolbaugh from Route 402 southbound, is going to be eliminated. Also, dedicated lanes to turn off Coolbaugh onto Route 402, in either direction, will be divided from the single turn onto Coolbaugh.

Temporary lanes will need to be placed, so drainage can be rerouted. Slight elevation changes will be made to improve the intersection as well.

The project will take probably 4 – 6 weeks to complete. While the construction period may cause some delay and inconvenience, once completed, these improvements will make the intersection safer.

In addition to the intersection, we will be paving a good portion of Coolbaugh Road from Route 402 to approximately Tego Lake Road. That's roughly 2 miles of road!

We are asking all drivers for patience and understanding. Construction does takes time -- but the end results will last a long time. Please drive carefully, and please slow down through the construction site.

Middle Smithfield Township in conjunction with Smithfield Township and the Eastern Monroe Regional Parks Commission are excited to begin construction this spring on the River's Edge Family Bike Park.

Located on River Road in Smithfield Township near Brodhead Creek, River's Edge Family Bike Park will have a number of beginner level bumps and paths that bikers of every level can enjoy. Construction is scheduled to begin by the end of March, and the Supervisors of Middle Smithfield and Smithfield Townships hope to have the park open by the end of June.

"This project has been in the works for long time," said Middle Smithfield Township Parks Director Michael Dwyer. "We are excited to finally move into this first phase of construction."

River's Edge Park is one of two parks run by the Eastern Monroe Regional Parks Commission, an intergovernmental group dedicated to developing and maintaining parks in the eastern part of Monroe County. Future phases of expansion at the bike park are planned for future years. The Commission was originally formed as a cooperative effort between Middle Smithfield, Smithfield, and Price Townships and Delaware Water Gap Borough and consists of members from each community. Mt. Nebo Park, located at 406 Mt. Nebo Road, was also formed under the Commission.

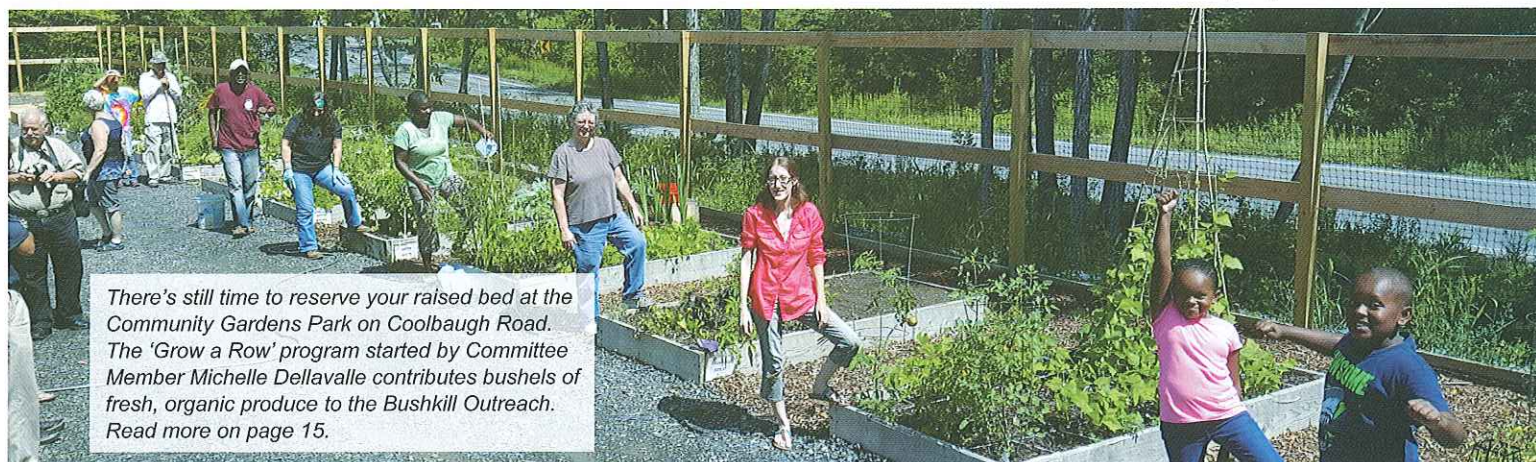
COMMUNITY GARDENS PARK RECEIVES GRANT

The Middle Smithfield Township Board of Supervisors and their Parks and Recreation Committee are excited to announce that Middle Smithfield Township was awarded a \$2,000 grant from St. Luke's University Health Network for the Community Gardens Park Improvements and Expansion Project.

St. Luke's offered the 2017 Community and School Garden Grant as part of its Healthy Citizen Program, which promotes healthy lifestyles through good nutrition and community outreach using local farms and community gardens.

Middle Smithfield Township plans to use the funds to make improvements to Community Gardens Park, located at 989 Coolbaugh Road. Planned improvements include additional raised garden plots, a 10' x 10' native plant and pollinator demonstration garden run by the Penn State Extension Monroe County Master Gardeners, reinforcing and protecting the apiary from local wildlife, providing gardeners with supplies such as mulch, manure, and soil, and planning for the next phase of expansion at the park.

The Community Gardens Park is open to the public year round. Township residents, non-profit organizations, and businesses may reserve up to 3 raised plots. Gardeners are required to attend a free organic gardening course from the Monroe County Penn State Master Gardeners, which are offered throughout the year at the Gardens and Township Building. Gardeners are also encouraged to donate part of their produce to the Bushkill Outreach Food Pantry via its "Grow a Row" program

IN THE ZONE:

The Board of Supervisors adopted ordinance 213 on March 23, 2017, amending Chapter 200, Zoning, Division 83, Zoning Hearing Board, section 083-010, Membership. The amendments will allow for the appointment of Zoning Hearing Board Alternates and adds qualification requirements for Zoning Hearing Board members.

The Zoning Hearing Board acts as a "local court" for zoning matters. The five member board hears various appeals from the determinations of the zoning officers, may grant relief from the literal terms of the ordinance in certain hardship situations, hears challenges to the validity of the ordinance, and reviews applications for "special exception uses", which are permitted uses requiring a review. When submitted to the Monroe County Planning Commission for comment, they praised the efforts of the Supervisors saying "The Township should be commended for ensuring members are aware and proficient in their duties as a regulatory body." The township expects that the additional education requirements will assist the Zoning Hearing Board in their voluntary role in the community.

MIDDLE SMITHFIELD TOWNSHIP HOSTS "COURSE ON ZONING ADMINISTRATION"

The PMPEI (PA Municipal Planning Education Institute) course in Zoning Administration is a 3-session in-depth course for zoning hearing board members, zoning administrators, planning commissioners, and elected officials in the principals and practices for administering municipal zoning ordinances. The course covers the technical aspects of the various zoning applications and appeals, such as variances, special exceptions and nonconforming uses, and the requirements for zoning hearings. Issues of fairness, compliance, and ordinance enforcement are included.

Part of the new educational requirements of zoning hearing board members, as adopted in ordinance 213 on March 23, 2017 (see separate article), is participation in this course. Normally, this course is held hours away from our region; however, Middle Smithfield Township proactively arranged to host this course at the township building on Tuesdays, April 25, May 2 and May 9. Now, neighboring townships also have the opportunity to participate.

PMPEI is an educational program of the PA Chapter-APA and PA State Association of Boroughs. This course is sponsored by the Northeast Section of PA Chapter-APA and Middle Smithfield Township.

SIGN OF THE TIMES:

The Board of Supervisors adopted ordinance 212 on March 23, 2017, amending sections of Chapter 200, Zoning, Division 90, Signs. Amendments include, but are not limited to, additional and updated definitions, additional prohibited signs, and clarification of special event signs. Letters to all property and business owners along Route 209 were sent in early April advising of the newly adopted revisions and how it may affect the display of signs on their properties. The Board of Supervisors, through the efforts of the Zoning Office, is working to create a more shopper-friendly and profitable business corridor for the benefit of all residents and business owners in Middle Smithfield Township.

THE ZONING OFFICE IN ACTION

Under the direction of the Board of Supervisors, the Zoning Office has been hard at work to clean up the Route 209 Commercial Corridor of illegal signs. Often, the property owner is not aware that the signs that have been placed along the edge of the road are, in fact, not permitted. But we have found that property owners are more often than not willing to comply.

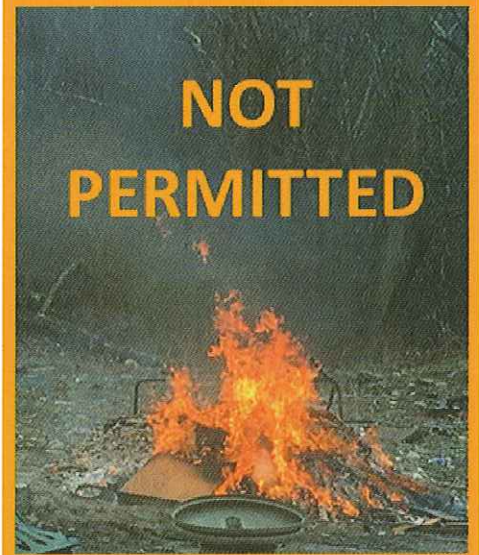
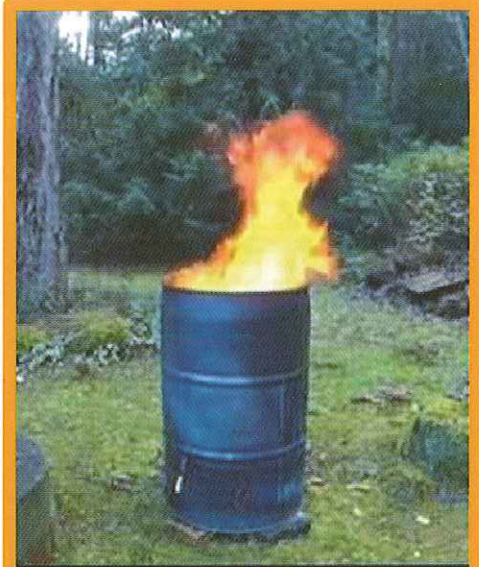

OUTDOOR WOOD-FIRED BURNERS ORDINANCE:

The Board of Supervisors adopted ordinance 211 on February 23, 2017, adding chapter 196 entitled "Outdoor Wood-Fired Burners" to the township code. This ordinance requires that any person desiring to install an outdoor wood-fired burner first obtain the necessary permits from Zoning Office. The Building Code regulates fireplaces and furnaces inside the home; this ordinance regulates the placement, installation and proper use of wood burning furnaces outside the home. It also allows the Zoning Officer to initiate enforcement remedies against any property owner that violates the ordinance. For the health, safety and welfare of all residents, this ordinance will ensure that outdoor wood-fired burners are maintained and operated in accordance with manufacturer's specifications and that only appropriate substances are burned.

AS A REMINDER, BURNING IS NOT PERMITTED in Middle Smithfield Township.

The only exception to this rule is a recreational fire pit in which you burn fire wood. Open burning of any substance, even in a burn barrel, is strictly prohibited and could result in a fine.

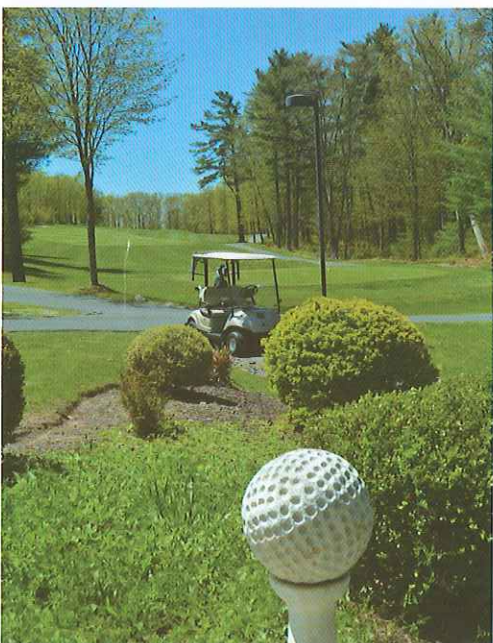

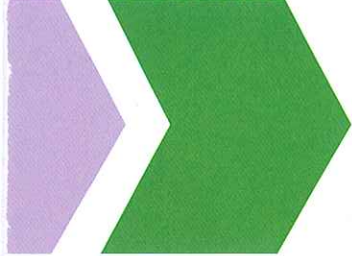
